



INFORMATION SHEET FOR TRUCK AND ROAD TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS

WHO ARE THE SALVAGE ORGANISATION?



The salvage organisation represents insurance companies and the Swedish Transport Administration. We're called to accidents by SOS Alarm for three main reasons: (1) managing environmental damage, (2) enabling passable roads, and (3) saving goods.



Salvage managers coordinate the work after an accident and are authorised to make quick decisions on the spot. To do that, we need information about ownership and insurance.



The salvage manager documents the incident at site with notes and pictures. The report is then shared with the insurance companies involved and the Swedish Transport Administration responsible for state-owned roads.



The salvage manager can assist with contacts and coordination for tow trucks, but those responsible for costs and payments are the vehicle owner and the owner of the goods.

WE NEED THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

OWNER OF THE VEHICLE

- Contact details for the owner of the vehicle
- Contact details for the owner of the vehicle's insurance company
- If non-Swedish company:* Contact details for the owner of the vehicle's correspondent in Sweden
- Invoice details for the vehicle's owner (for the tow truck)

GOODS

- Who is the recipient of the goods?
- Who is the sender of the goods?
- Contact details for the owner of the goods during transport (sender, recipient, forwarder)
- Contact details for the owner of the goods' insurance company
- Are there multiple recipients of the goods?
- What kind of goods is it?
- Is there a cold chain to take into account?
- What was the value of the goods before the accident?
- What is the value of the goods after the accident?
- Are the goods crucial for a production chain?
